To the Cupertino Union School District Community:

With guidance from the California Department of Public Health and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the Santa Clara County Public Health Department is now taking the position that the swine flu is not as serious a threat as originally thought. Reported cases of swine flu are now being treated as if they were any other flu. As a result, schools in Santa Clara County will no longer be routinely ordered closed on the basis of a probable case of swine flu.

The district would like to thank you for your cooperation through this entire process. Be assured that we learned a lot from this experience and were able to implement additional safety protocols should we face a pandemic outbreak in the future.

Even though the threat of school closures is behind us, it is important that our children continue to follow good health practices at all times and be kept at home when they are ill. The district will continue to be proactive by promoting the healthy habits being enforced at the school sites, such as frequent hand washing and covering coughs and sneezes.
