Walk-A-Thon Rules

2011



-  Dogs, bicycle riding, rollerblading, skateboarding, or riding scooters are not permitted.
-  All Walk-A-Thon participants and guests are expected to be supervised by an adult at all times. We welcome visits from alumni, but children under 16 must be under the supervision of an adult.
-  All donations must be turned in to the school by 2:30 PM, Friday, October 21, 2011, for the student to be considered a participant and eligible for awards.
-  Parents are encouraged to seek matching funds from their companies/families. These dollars really help our school. However, matching funds do not count as earned dollars for the students.
-  Students must walk the course themselves. No one may carry or walk for a participating child.
-  Handicapped students are allowed special considerations for walking laps during Walk-A-Thon. Please contact the Walk-A-Thon chairpersons prior to Walk-A-Thon so arrangements may be made. We want every child to enjoy the day.
-  West Valley students are welcome to bring friends or siblings. Only laps walked and money earned by West Valley students will be used when laps are tallied for competitions. Friends and siblings may wear a Guest lap card. Visitors under 16 years must have a signed permission slip from his/her parents to participate.
-  If a student is unable to attend the Walk-A-Thon, please contact a chairperson. To be considered a qualified participant, the student's signed Sponsor Sheet and a minimum of \$30 in flat donations must be turned into the office by 2:30 PM, Friday, October 21, 2011. This guarantees the student to be considered for all awards.

Challenges & Eligibility

Grand Drawing eligibility: Participating students are eligible if recognized in one of the following categories:

- Grand Champion (most laps walked in either upper or lower grades, or most money collected in either upper or lower grades)
- Grade-Level Champion (most laps walked per grade, most money collected per grade)
- Classroom Winners (3 winners for most laps walked, 3 winners for most money collected)

Grade-Level challenges: Each classroom will be competing for the most laps walked and most donations collected against other classrooms at their grade level. Winning classrooms at each grade level will keep a championship certificate in their classroom for the year.

Classroom challenges: The upper and lower grade classrooms that carry their class flag the most laps will be recognized. Only West Valley students may carry class flags.

In the event of a tie for designated awards, multiple winners will be declared.
